

As of 2018, nearly endowment was community and access to capital for entrepreneurs of color and innovation in human services





The Annie E. Casey Foundation works to develop solutions so that all children in the United States can have a brighter future. We tackle this ambitious mission with many partners, using strategies that include grant making, hands-on consulting, policy advocacy, leadership development, research, data and demonstration projects.
