STANDARD CONDITIONS OF JUVENILE PROBATION

In addition to all special conditions contained in the Order for Probation, the Juvenile shall:

1. Obey all laws;

- Report to the assigned case manager as directed and follow all lawful instruction of the case manager.

Juvenile Case No.:

Pilot sites in Washington state replaced traditional court orders with "Colloquies", which are written at a sixth grade level

- The pilot sites implemented the colloquies and accompanying forms for three months.
- Sites conducted youth survey and court observations both pre- and post-implementation.
- In one court, youth interviewed reported understanding 90% of the conditions of release and probation ordered by the judge.
- This is a 158% percent change in the level of understanding when compared to the level of understanding prior to the introduction of the colloquies.
